

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, W. BDY., T 24 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

from which bearing trees mkd. in 1944:

An incense cedar, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 47° E., 107 lks. dist. mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 31 BT.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 17°45' W., 95 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 36 BT.

The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. is located N. 5° W., 29 lks. dist. from a corner of fences extending approximately N. and E.

N. 0°30' W., beginning new measurement.

Asc. 85 ft. over broken SW. slope.

4.00 A spur, slopes S. 70° W.; desc. 66 ft. over NW. slope.

9.60 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course SW.; ascend 727 ft. over broken S. slope.

37.90 A spur ridge, bears N. 45° W. and S, 60° E.; desc. 19 ft. over NE. slope.

39.34 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, as determined from the remaining original bearing trees which are as follows:

A fir, 44 ins. diam., bears N. 61° E., 10 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks on old bark blaze.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 77° E., 15 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks on old bark blaze.

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 20° W., 55 lks. dist., with surface scar indicating old blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 51° W., 15 lks. dist., mkd. T 24 S R 4 W S 25 BT.

Land, mountainous, rolling and level.

Soil, sandy and rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, alder, madrona and yew.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, salal, salmonberry, arrowwood, willow, hazel, bracken, poison oak and huckleberry.

N. 0°09' E., along the W. bdy. of sec. 30.

Desc. 506 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

23.45 A branch, 1 lk. wide, course E.; asc. 20 ft. over SE. slope.

24.05 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 53 ft. over NE. slope.

26.20 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 55 ft. over SE. slope.

29.60 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 84 ft. over NE. slope.
