

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, W. BDY., T. 24 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.
Soil, sandy clay loam.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, madrona, yew, dogwood and chinquapin.
Undergrowth, vinemaple, salal, bracken, willow, arrowwood, hazel, thimbleberry, salmonberry and huckleberry.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISION OF
T. 24 S., R. 3 W.

(Restoration of the 1871 survey of William H. Byars
and 1883 survey of Laban H. Wheeler.)

The cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29 was remonumented by the county surveyor when the original corner evidence was intact with a yew wood post, 5 ft. long, 5 ins. sq., mkd. T 24 S S 21 on NE., R 3 W.S 28 on SE., S 29 on SW., and S.20 on NW. face; from which the only remaining original bearing tree:

A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 55½° E., 46 lks. dist., with surface scar indicating an old blaze. (Record bearing S. 75° E.)

And bearing trees marked by the county surveyor,

A stumphole, bears N. 52° E., 15 lks. dist.

A stumphole, bears S. 63½° W., 60 lks. dist.

A yew, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 38½° W., 35 lks. dist., with surface scar indicating old blaze. (Record N. 44° W., 26 lks. dist.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 16 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 13°45' W., 55 lks. dist., mkd. T 24 S R 3 W S 29 BT.

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 81°45' W., 67 lks. dist., mkd. T 24 S R 3 W S 20 BT.

Reset the yew wood stake inverted and alongside the iron post.

N. 2°27' E., bet. secs. 20 and 21.

Asc. 134 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, in logged area.

- 2.10 An abandoned graded dirt logging road, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.
- 14.10 A spur, slopes NW.; desc. 129 ft. over NW. slope, changing to NE. slope.
- 22.30 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 60° W.; asc. 71 ft. over SW. slope.
- 29.00 A spur, slopes NW; desc. 118 ft. over NW. slope.
