  - 59.50 A branch, 10 lks. wide, course S.30°E., at a waterfall 20 ft. high; asc. 107 ft. over NE. slope.
  - 62.80 A spur, slopes SE.; desc. 45 ft. over SW. slope.
  - 69.00 A branch, 5 lks. wide, course S.20°E.; asc. 57 ft. over NE. slope.
  - 77.70 A spur, slopes S.30°E.; desc. 22 ft. over SW. slope.
  - 79.50 A branch, 12 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 61 ft. over SE. slope.
  - 84.70 A spur, slopes SE.; desc. 7 ft. over SW. slope.
  - 85.05 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 174 ft. over NE. slope.

 Soil, sandy loam and rocky clay; 2d and 3d rate.  
 Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, alder, yew, maple, madrona, dogwood, and oak.  
 Undergrowth, vinemaple, salal, willow, bracken, arrowwood, salmonberry, huckleberry, manzanita, lilac, slickleaf, poison oak, and syringa.

  - 26.80 A spur, slopes SE.; desc. 22 ft. over NE. slope.
  - 29.40 A branch, 7 lks. wide, course S.70°E.; asc. 240 ft. over SW. slope.
  - 42.88 Point for original  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., determined by reference to the record bearings from both old bearing trees.
