from which

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.86½°E., 40 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks on face of old bark blaze. (Old B.T.)

A red cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S.68¼°E., 23 lks. dist., mkd. S 13 T 25 R 3 B T. (Old B.T.)

A hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S.53°W., 18 lks. dist., mkd. S 14 T 25 R 3 B T. (Old B.T.)

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N.38½°W., 18 lks. dist., with blaze healed. (Old B.T.)

A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.76 3/4°E., 16 lks. dist., mkd. T 25 S R 3 W S 12 B T. (New B.T.)

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, sandy loam and rocky clay; 2d and 3d rate.
 Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, pine, maple, madrona, chinquapin, alder, and dogwood.
 Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, salal, willow, bracken, arrowwood, hazel, manzanita, and slickleaf.

From the cor. of secs. 12 and 13 only, on the E. bdy. of the Tp.

S. 84° 14' W., bet. secs. 12 and 13.

Desc. 183 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 9.30 Top of bluff, 75 ft. high, bears N.85°W. and S.85°E.
- 10.50 Foot of descent on S. talus slope; thence over talus slope strewn with huge boulders.
- 16.50 Leave talus slope, bears NE. and SW.; asc. 50 ft. over SE. slope.
- 17.70 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 111 ft. over SW. slope.
- 22.60 A branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.; asc. 15 ft. over SE. slope.
- 23.60 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 43 ft. over SW. slope.
- 27.00 A branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.; asc. 408 ft. over broken SE. slope.
- 34.00 A spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.
- 45.54 Proportional measurement.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
