General Description

This portion of the township is mountainous broken land covered with heavy fir, yellow pine, live oak, white oak, black oak and myrtle, with dense undergrowth of same including tan oak and arrow-wood.

The mineral appears to be chromium and placer gold along the creeks.

The township boundary runs over a series of conglomerate bluffs.

There is some good agricultural land to be found along the creeks.

Logsdon Brothers are the only settlers in the township, their claim being located in sections 5 and 6.
