(Record description, N. 30° E., 30 lks.)</p> <p>A fir, 54 ins. diam., bears S. 9° E., 20 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 9 W S 19 BT on old bark blaze. (Record description, S. 7½° E., 18 lks.)</p> <p>A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 75° W., 34 lks. dist., with old bark blaze nearly scaled away. (Record distance, 38 lks.) I reblaze this tree below the original blaze and mark T 20 S R 10 W S 13 BT.</p> <p>Place a yellow location poster on each of the original bearing trees, and mark new bearing trees as follows:</p> <p>A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 24° E., 32 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 9 W S 19 BT.</p> <p>A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 31½° W., 61 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 24 BT.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin and cascara.
