A cedar, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 78° W., 70 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 BT.

Ascend 20 ft. over NW. slope.

38.50 Top of ascent on N. slope; desc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.

40.60 A ravine, course N. 60° W.; asc. 260 ft. over W. slope.

46.70 A spur ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. 400 ft. over steep E. slope.

55.65 A branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.; desc. 75 ft. along broken N. slope.

A maple, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 69 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E., 109 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 2 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 48°45' W., 91 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 3 BT.

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 84 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 19 S R 10 W S 34 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and maple.

Undergrowth, vine maple, evergreen huckleberry, salmonberry, red huckleberry, hazel, and salal.

S. 89°15' E., bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Ascend 160 ft. over broken NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

9.20 A spur, slopes N. 30° E.; desc. 612 ft. over steep and broken E. slope.

23.00 Cedar Creek (Fisher Creek), 40 lks. wide, course N. 30° E.; asc. 340 ft. over W. slope.
