

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

A spur, slopes N. 35° W.; desc. 262 ft. over steep NE. slope.

Point for the cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A cedar, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 70° E., 8 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 13 BT.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 78°45' E., 176 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 24 BT.

A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N. 78° W., 160 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 14 BT.

The sec. cor. is located at the top of a bluff, 50 ft. high, facing NE. There is no suitable bearing tree available to the SW.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, yew, cascara, madrona, dogwood and chinquapin.

Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, evergreen huckleberry, thimbleberry, red huckleberry, hazel, arrowwood, and salal.

From the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, on the E. bdy. of the Tp. S. 71°11' W., bet. secs. 13 and 24.

Descend 98 ft. over W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.50 The dry bed of a stream, 3 lks. wide, course S. 20° W.; asc. 35 ft. over SE. slope.

4.35 Point of spur, slopes S.; desc. 38 ft. over SW. slope.

6.30 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 514 ft. over steep E. slope, changing to NE. slope.

21.60 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 2 ft. along back of spur.

22.40 A ridge, the divide bet. Johnson Creek and Spencer Creek, bears N. and S.; desc. 244 ft. over NW. slope, changing to N. slope.

31.75 A spur, slopes NW.; desc. 151 ft. over W. slope.

34.20 A ravine, course N. 30° W.; asc. 32 ft. over NE. slope.

34.90 A spur, slopes N.; desc. 84 ft. over NW. slope, changing to W. slope.

41.55 A ravine, course NW.; asc. 27 ft. over NE. slope.

42.565 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
