

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines. of T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS 76.25	Spencer Creek, 1 lk. wide, in gravel channel, 30 lks. wide, course S. 10° W. on bend from NE.; asc. 400 ft. over SE. slope.
87.11	The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14.  Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy and rocky loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and maple. Undergrowth, salmonberry, vine maple, hazel, evergreen huckleberry, red huckleberry, elder and thimbleberry.
	N. 5°51' W., bet. secs. 11 and 12.  Ascend 40 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
2.75	A spur, slopes N. 80° E.; desc. 256 ft. over N. slope.
8.50	A ravine, course N. 70° E.; asc. 26 ft. over SE. slope.
11.30	Top of ascent on E. slope; desc. 96 ft. over NE. slope.
14.70	The dry bed of a stream, 5 lks. wide, course S. 30° E.; asc. 127 ft. over SW. slope.
18.90	Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 47 ft. over NW. slope.
20.70	The dry bed of a stream, 3 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 263 ft. over SE. slope.
26.40	A spur, slopes S. 30° W.; desc. 87 ft. over broken W. slope.
34.75	The dry bed of a stream, 3 lks. wide, course S. 40° W.; asc. 68 ft. over SE. slope.
37.625	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked  $\begin{array}{c} \frac{1}{4} \\   \\ S\ 11\   \ S\ 12 \\   \\ 1952 \end{array}$
	From which  A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 17° E., 35 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 12 BT.  A maple, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 28° W., 78 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 BT.
	Ascend 290 ft., over broken SE. slope, changing to S. slope.
45.90	A ridge, the divide bet. Spencer Creek and Cedar Creek, bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.; desc. 144 ft. over broken NW. slope.
50.50	A ravine, course W.; asc. 126 ft. over S. slope.
54.20	A spur ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 232 ft. over NE. slope.
61.80	A spur, slopes N. 30° E.; desc. 104 ft. over N. slope.
63.80	A ravine, course E.; asc. 66 ft. over SE. slope.
65.50	A spur, slopes N. 70° E.; desc. 88 ft., over N. slope.
