

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS 71.95	The dry bed of a stream, 7 lks. wide, course S. 15° E.; asc. 264 ft. over E. slope.
78.09	The cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27. Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and maple. Undergrowth, salmonberry, thimbleberry, elder, wild cucumber, vine maple, evergreen huckleberry, hazel, arrowwood, and salal.
	N. 5°22' E., bet. secs. 22 and 23. Descend 180 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
4.90	An intermittent stream, 4 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 550 ft. over broken SW. slope, changing to S. slope.
21.50	A spur ridge, bears N. 65° W. and S. 65° E.; desc. 250 ft. over N. slope.
26.70	A ravine, course S. 80° E.; asc. 180 ft. over SE. slope.
32.00	A spur, slopes S. 85° E.; desc. 160 ft. over broken NE. slope, changing to E. slope.
37.215	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 23, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked <div style="text-align: center;"> $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 S 23 1951 </div> from which A fir, 68 ins. diam., bears N. 54° W., 48 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 BT. A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 84 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 BT. Along E. slope.
39.70	A small spur, slopes N. 80° E.; desc. slightly along E. slope.
43.50	A spur, slopes N. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E.; desc. 330 ft. along spur.
53.70	Top of a cut bank, 10 ft. high, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.; desc. 10 ft. over cut bank.
54.00	A creek, 30 lks. wide, course S. 60° E.; asc. 35 ft. over S. slope.
56.00	The low point of a spur, slopes SW.; desc. 10 ft. over NW. slope.
57.40	A ravine, course S. 20° W.; asc. 411 ft. over SE. slope.
68.30	A spur, slopes S. 75° W.; desc. 65 ft. over NW. slope.
71.90	The head of a ravine, course S. 80° W.; asc. 65 ft. over SW. slope.
74.23	A spur, slopes W.; desc. 2 ft. over NW. slope.
74.43	Point for the cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
