

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS	
18.20	A ravine, course S. 25° W.; asc. 70 ft. over SE. slope.
21.20	Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 140 ft. over SW. slope.
26.45	The dry bed of a stream, 2 lks. wide, course S. 35° E.; asc. 5 ft. over E. slope.
26.95	A low point, slopes S. 10° E.; desc. 5 ft. over W. slope.
27.15	The dry bed of a stream, 5 lks. wide, course S. on bend to SE.; asc. 360 ft. over E. slope, changing to rolling NE. slope.
40.57	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 14, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked $\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 11}{S 14}$ 1952 from which A hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 31° W., 37 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 BT. A hemlock, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 39 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 14 BT. Ascend 40 ft. over rolling NE. slope.
42.50	Top of ascent on N. slope; desc. 87 ft. over NW. slope.
46.40	A branch, 1 lk. wide, in bare rock channel, 5 lks. wide, course N. 20° E.; line crosses just above a waterfall, 30 ft. high; asc. 270 ft. over E. slope, changing to NE. slope.
53.85	A spur, slopes N. 40° W.; desc. 125 ft. over NW. slope.
57.20	A ravine, course N. 10° E.; asc. 200 ft. over E. slope.
61.60	A ridge, bears N. 5° W. and S. 5° E.; desc. 360 ft. over general W. slope.
70.70	A ravine, course S. 70° W.; desc. 15 ft. along broken S. slope.
75.70	A spur, slopes S. 60° W.; desc. 80 ft. over W. slope.
77.35	A branch, 1 lk. wide, in bare rock channel, 7 lks. wide, course S. 20° W.; asc. 90 ft. over broken SE. slope.
81.14	The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15. Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy and rocky loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, yew and maple. Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, rhododendron, evergreen huckleberry, red huckleberry, thimbleberry, hazel and salal.
	N. 2°58' W., bet. secs. 10 and 11. Ascend 265 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
7.35	A spur, slopes S. 10° W.; asc. 145 ft. along W. slope, changing to broken SW. slope.
17.40	A ridge, the divide bet. Spencer Creek and Cedar Creek, bears N. 40° W. and S. 40° E.; desc. 280 ft. over NE. slope, changing to N. slope.
