A double alder, 34 ins. diam., bears N. $61\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ E., 71 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 3 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $18^\circ 45'$ E., 36 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 10 BT.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 32° W., 17 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 9 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 24° W., 46 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 4 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple and alder.

Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, evergreen huckleberry, salal, salmonberry and thimbleberry.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

N. $89^\circ 35'$ W., bet. secs. 3 and 10.

Ascend 250 ft. over SE. slope.

- 9.50 A spur ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 140 ft. over NW. slope.
- 18.90 A spur, slopes N. 25° W.; desc. 120 ft. over W. slope.
- 20.60 A wet ravine, course N.; asc. 55 ft. over NE. slope.
- 22.40 Top of ascent on N. slope; desc. 57 ft. over NW. slope.
- 25.15 A ravine, course N. 25° E.; asc. 120 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 28.80 A ravine, course N. 30° E.; ascend 80 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 31.90 A ravine, course NE.; asc. 240 ft. over E. slope.
- 36.90 A ridge, the divide bet. Cedar Creek and Georgia Creek, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. 100 ft. over SW. slope.
- 38.68 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. $89\frac{1}{4}^\circ$ W., 29 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 BT.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. $18\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ E., 31 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 10 BT.

Descend 70 ft. over SW. slope.

- 40.70 The head of a ravine, course S.; asc. 80 ft. over SE. slope.
