

# County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, sandy loam.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder and maple.  
Undergrowth, salmonberry, evergreen huckleberry, vinemaple, hazel,  
thimbleberry, elder, wild cucumber, rhododendron and salal.

From the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16.

N. 84°24' W., bet. secs. 9 and 16.

Descend 560 ft. over NW. slope, changing to bluffy W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

14.95 Georgia Creek, 1 lk. wide, in gravel bed 15 lks. wide, course SW.; about 1½ chs. downstream a large fork enters from SE.; asc. 70 ft. over SE. slope.

19.80 Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 40 ft. over SW. slope.

21.80 A branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.; asc. 85 ft. over E. slope.

23.90 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 85 ft. over SW. slope.

27.00 A ravine, course S.; asc. 140 ft. over broken SE. slope.

34.30 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 110 ft. over SW. slope.

37.00 A ravine, course S.; asc. 155 ft. over E. slope, changing to SE. slope.

40.45 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 16, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

$$\frac{1}{4} \frac{S \ 9}{S \ 16 \ 1952}$$

from which

A dogwood, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 83° W., 4 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 9 BT.

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 77½° W., 39 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 16 BT.

Ascend 15 ft. over SE. slope.

40.80 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 140 ft. over SW. slope.

46.80 A ravine, course S.; asc. 100 ft. over SE. slope.

49.40 A spur, slopes S. 20° W.; desc. 150 ft. over W. slope.

52.45 A wet ravine, course S. 10° W.; asc. 140 ft. over E. slope.

56.35 A spur, slopes S. 30° E.; desc. 55 ft. over broken SW. slope.

61.00 A ravine, course S.; asc. 49 ft. over broken S. slope.

80.90 The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, determined at the record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing tree, as follows:

A rotted fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 69½° E., 58 lks. dist., in which I uncover the face of an old blaze marked S 16 T 20 R 10 BT.
