Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

A maple, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 65½° W., 52 lks. dist., marked ½ S 8 BT.

Chisel a large X on W. face of corner stone.

N. 4°20' E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 426 ft. over S. slope, changing to SE. slope.

11.50 A spur ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 74 ft. along W. slope, changing to NW. slope.

20.00 Foot of descent; asc. 101 ft. over gradual SW. slope.

31.00 Enter heavy timber and dense undergrowth; irregular edge bears NW. and SE.

38.04 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, determined at the record bearing and distance from each of the original bearing trees, as follows:

An alder, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 72° E., 35 lks. dist., marked S 4 T 20 S R 10 W BT on the bark.

A fir, 56 ins. diam., bears S. 30° E., 85 lks. dist., marked S 9 T 20 S R 10 W BT on bark blaze.

An uprooted fir, 60 ins. diam., the stump hole of which bears S. 60° W., 55 lks. dist., with blaze on under side of trunk.

An alder, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 69° W., 53 lks. dist., marked S 5 T 20 S R 10 W BT on the bark.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which a new bearing tree

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 45°45' W., 139 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 8 BT.

Land, mountainous and rolling.

Soil, sandy loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder and maple.

Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, evergreen huckleberry, salal, hazel, rhododendron, thimbleberry, slickleaf, manzanita and arrowwood.

From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

N. 81°45' W., bet. secs. 4 and 9.

Ascend 85 ft. over E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.80 A spur, slopes N. 40° E.; desc. 56 ft. over NW. slope.

4.40 Foot of descent on N. slope; asc. 74 ft. over NE. slope.

6.75 A spur, slopes N. 30° W.; desc. 386 ft. over SW. slope.

16.15 A branch, 1 lk. wide, course N. 75° W.; thence along N. slope.
