CHAINS

The Forest Service Monument, a large boulder in Deadman Creek, mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, bears S. 46°21' W., 6.66 chs. dist., I destroy markings on trees and boulder.

The cor. of secs. 1 and 2 on the N. bdy. of T. 30 S., R. 2 W., a stone, mkd. and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, bears S. 6°45' W., 42.96 chs. dist.

The mag. bearing of the true mer. at 2 p.m., l.m.t., is 21°02' W. The mean mag. decl. is 21°08' E.

Pits and mounds impracticable at this and all other corners.

I run -

N. 81°26' W., on true line to Cor. 2.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth. Descend.

1.40 Enter creek bottom, bears N. and S., 50 ft. below Cor. 1.

2.37 Deadman Creek, 35 lks. wide, course S.

3.50 Leave bottom and enter rolling land, bears NW. and SE.

8.00 To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. H/12 of listing survey, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, in place of which I

Set an igneous stone, 24 x 12 x 12 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 2, chiseled 2 H E S 141 on NE. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 42°00' E., 25 lks. dist.,

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 14°00' E., 9 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 2 H E S 141 BT.

Land, mountainous, level and rolling.
 Timber, pine, fir, cedar and maple.
 Soil, 1st and 3rd rate.

Thence -

N. 0°57' W. on true line to Cor. 3.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

11.03 To Cor. No. 3, identical with Cor. H/11 of listing survey, a tree, uprooted, mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, in place of which I

Set an igneous stone, 24 x 12 x 10 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 3, chiseled 3 H E S 141 on NE. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 34°45' W., 26 lks. dist.,

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 61°30' W., 10 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 3 H E S 141 BT.

Land, rolling.
 Timber, pine, fir, cedar and maple.
 Soil, 2nd rate.

June 29, 1914, At Cor. No. 2, I set off 23°16' N. on the decl. arc, and at apparent noon, I obs. the sun on the mer.; the resulting lat. is 42°58½' N.
