Metes and Bounds Survey of Ben Williams, Homestead Entry
Umpqua National Forest, Oregon.

CHAINS

June 30, 1914.

Thence -

N. 59°00' W., on true line to Cor. 4.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

21.15 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.

40.00 Brook, 4 lks. wide, course NE.

43.03 Claimant's fence, bears NE. and SW.

43.27 Trail, bears NE. and SW.

Leave heavy timber and enter scattering timber, bears NE. and SW.

45.51 To Cor. No. 4, identical with Cor. H/10 of listing survey, a hollow stump, mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor; in place of which, (after removing shell of stump), I

Set an igneous stone, 24 x 12 x 6 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. No. 4, chiseled 4 H E S 141 on NE. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 6°15' W., 14 lks. dist.,

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 60°00' W., 36 lks. dist.,
both trees blazed and scribed 4 H E S 141 BT.

Land, rolling.

Timber, pine, fir and cedar.

Soil, 2nd rate.

Thence -

N. 73°53' W., on true line to Cor. 5.

Over rolling land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

9.86 To Cor. No. 5, identical with Cor. H/9 of listing survey, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, in place of which I

Set a wash boulder, 24 x 12 x 6 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 5, mkd. 5 H E S 141 on NE. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 16°45' W., 15 lks. dist.,

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 69°30' W., 9½ lks. dist.,
both trees blazed and scribed 5 H E S 141 BT.

Land, rolling, timber fir and cedar.

Soil, 1st rate.

June 30, 1914, I set off 23°12' N. on the decl. arc, and at apparent noon, I obs. the sun on the Pol. mer., near claimant's house; the resulting lat. is 42°59' N.

June 30, 1914.

July 1, 1914.

N. 7°26' E. on true line to Cor. 6.

Over rolling land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

1.90 West Fork of Deadman Creek, 30 lks. wide, course E. Leave rolling and enter level bottom land, bears E. and W.
