Timber, fir, maple, cedar and madrona; undergrowth, vine maple, huckleberry, arrowwood and hazel.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Section 35, township 31 south, range 5 west, is located in the Umpqua National Forest on the east and west slopes of Canyon Creek Canyon approximately 6 miles south of Canyonville, Oregon. The land is mountainous and is crossed by high ridges and cut by deep canyons. The east half of the section is cut, in a north and south direction, by Canyon Creek Canyon through which runs U.S. Highway No. 99. The elevation ranges from 1800 to 3000 ft. above sea level.

The section is timbered with fir, maple, cedar, madrona, with some ash along the streams. The undergrowth consists of vine maple, huckleberry, arrowwood and hazel.

The section is valuable because of its production of timber. There are no dwellings and no known mineral deposits.
