

Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of Sec. 2, T. 32 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

Soil, rocky clay.
Timber, fir, maple, cedar and madrona; undergrowth, vine maple, huckleberry, arrowwood and hazel.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Sections 2 and 3, township 32 south, range 5 west, are located in the Umpqua National Forest approximately 7 miles south of Canyonville, Oregon. The land is mountainous and is crossed by high ridges and cut by deep canyons. Section 2 is cut, just west of the north and south center line, by Canyon Creek Canyon through which runs Canyon Creek and the Pacific Highway. The elevation of sections 2 and 3 ranges from 1800 ft. to 3500 ft. above sea level.

The two sections are valuable because of their production of timber which consists of fir, maple, cedar and madrona, with some ash along the streams. The undergrowth consists of vine maple, huckleberry, arrowwood and hazel.

There are no dwellings and no known mineral deposits.
