

Survey No. 138

CHAINS

Field notes of survey of the Noumeite Placer Nickel and Chrome Mine, located in section 17, T. 30 S., R. 6 W., of Willamette Meridian, Excelsior Mining District, County of Douglas and State of Oregon.

James Clark and Joseph L. Scott, chainmen, and W. L. Brown as axman were duly sworn on the sixteenth day of November, A.D. 1886, and of the same day proceeded to survey the said mine for Edson Adams and Harvey S. Brown, trustee. Claim being designated as claim number (37) in T. 30 S., R. 6 W. of W. M. and comprising the SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 17.

Beginning the survey at a post marked No. 1 and claim 37 with a scribe, it also being the cor. post to secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21, T. 30 S., R. 6 W., being put in place by the established witness trees of the government survey, to wit:

A yellow pine, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 25° E., 260 lks. dist.

A yellow pine, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 20° W., 115 lks. dist.

A yellow pine, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 40° E., 164 lks. dist.

A yellow pine, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 171 lks. dist.

Also a high point of mountain, known as Tellerium Peak, bears S. 56° E., distant about six miles.

Also a high point, known as Silver Peak, bears S. 23° E., distant about five miles.

Course, distance and character of improvements on claim are connected to the same corner, as follows, to wit:

The dwelling house, 36 x 40 ft., bears N. 24° W., 11.60 chs.

Assay office, 10 x 14 ft., bears N. 21° W., 11.49 chs.

Barn, 24 x 28 ft., bears N. 31° W., 11.20 chs.

Wood house, 20 x 24 ft., bears N. 26°30' W., 12.30 chs.

Blacksmith shop, 18 x 20 ft., bears N. 34° W., 13.75 chs.

Coal house, 10 x 12 ft., bears N. 27° W., 13.30 chs.

Spring, bears N. 25° W., 14.70 chs.

Open cut, bears N. 67° W., 18.20 chs.; average width, 25 lks.; average depth, 25 lks., course of cut N. 5° W., 1.50 chs.

Face of tunnel bears N. 63° W., 18.70 chs.; course of tunnel, N. 14° W., 2.33 chs. to back end of tunnel. Adit 6 x 7 ft.

Shaft, 27 ft. deep, 4 x 4 ft., bears N. 61° W., 18.95 chs.

Excavations in rock and dirt.

Thence as follows

Magnetic variation 18°30' E., by solar compass. Altitude 1305 ft. above sea level and 992 ft. above the valley land on Cow Creek distant 3 or 4 miles.

Thence following the boundary lines of Claim No. (37), clearing brush and blazing line and noting all changes and objects that come in contact with the line.
