Deputy Mineral Surveyor for the First Mineral District of Oregon, hereby certify that the value of labor and improvements expended on the Emerald lode Claim Survey No. 186 claimed by Edson Adams and Harvey S. Brown trustee of Harvey Brown, situate in Excelsior Mining District, Township 30 S., R. 6 W., Willamette Meridian, Douglas County, Oregon, and represented by the annexed diagram, exceeds the sum of five hundred dollars, consisting of cuts and shafts to wit:

Cut No. 1, 41 ft. long, average depth $7\frac{1}{2}$ ft., average width, 8 ft.

Shaft No. 1, 33 ft. deep, shaft 4 x 4 ft. in the clear, well timbered.

Cut No. 2, 34 ft. long, average depth $11\frac{1}{2}$ ft., average width 10 ft.

Cut No. 3, 31 ft. long, average depth 3 ft., average width 4 ft.

And I further certify that the character of the lode or mine exposed is nickel bearing.
