CHAINS

The point of discovery of the Discovery lode is at the center post of the northerly end of claim.

The point of discovery of the Gold Standard lode is at the discovery cut and shaft. The center of southerly end of cut bears from center post of southerly end of claim, N. 79° E., 20 ft.

The point of discovery of the Buck lode is at the center post of the southerly end of claim.

The point of discovery of the Hoosier lode is at the center post of southerly end of claim.

The point of discovery of the Brown Bear is at the center post of southerly end of claim.

The point of discovery of the Black Bear lode is at the southwesterly end of claim.

NOTE

The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates of the bearing to a high point on Hungry Hill from center post on northerly end of Discovery lode is evidently a mistake in copying my amended location notes which shows the course to be S. 9° W. instead of S. 90° W.

The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificate of the Black Bear lode with regards to the position of the course of the boundary lines are due to errors in the former.
