CHAINS

At Sta. 3 a double timbered shaft, 8 x 12 ft. in size, extends vertically down 90 ft. At Sta. 4 a timbered tunnel, 5 x 7 ft. in size, runs S. 30° E., 20 ft. to breast. At Sta. 5 a timbered double compartment raise, 8 x 12 ft. in size, extends upward 80 ft. At pt. B a timbered drift, 5 x 7 ft. in size, runs S. 30° E., 70 ft. to breast. At pt. C a timbered double compartment raise, 8 x 12 ft. in size, extends upward 80 ft.

Value of tunnels, drifts and shafts, \$30,800.

Value of 1/11 interest, \$2,800.

This improvement is in the course of construction for the development of the Lucky Strike, Bonanza East Extension, Bonanza, J C, Elsie, Orbie, Granada SW., Queen, Uncle Billy SW. and Uncle Billy lodes of this survey, which are all contiguous lode claims owned in common within the range of benefit of said improvement.

The ground surface rises to the south, east, and west from the portal of the tunnel, and the extension of the tunnel, with the necessary laterals, affords a possible means of developing each of the stated lodes.

Five hundred dollars or over has been expended in this improvement in such a manner as tends to the development of each of the lodes just hereinbefore mentioned as sharing in the benefit of this common improvement subsequent to its location and to the time since which common ownership and contiguity have prevailed; therefore, an undivided one-eleventh interest in its value is hereby credited to each of said lodes.

No portion of or interest in this improvement has been credited heretofore as patent expenditure to any lode claim.

- No. 1 The discovery tunnel of the Maud S No. 1 lode, 5 x 7 ft. in size, the mouth of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 560 ft. from the center of line 4-1; from mouth, tunnel runs S. 68° E., 15 ft. to cave in; said to be 200 ft. long and corroborated by dump.
Value of open portion, \$300.
- No. 1 The discovery cut of the Maud S lode, the face of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 190 ft. from the center of line 2-3; 30 ft. wide, 20 ft. to face, runs N. 16° W., from face, 60 ft. to change in size; thence 9 ft. wide, 6 ft. deep, runs N. 16° W., 40 ft. to mouth.
Value \$2160.
- No. 1 The discovery cut of the Maud S No. 5 lode, the mouth of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 100 ft. from the center of line 3-4; 7 ft. wide, 5 ft. face, runs N. 70° W., 14 ft. to face.
Value, \$50.
- No. 1 The discovery cut of the Maud S West Extension No. 8 lode, the mouth of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 560 ft. from the center of line 2-3; 5 ft. wide, 8 ft. face, runs S. 68° E., 30 ft. to face.
Value, \$75.
- No. 1 The discovery cut of the Maud S West Extension No. 9 lode, the mouth of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 750 ft. from the center of line 2-3; 8 ft. wide, 6 ft. face, runs S. 69° E., 12 ft. to face.
Value, \$75.
- No. 1 The discovery cut of the Maud S West Extension No. 10 lode, the mouth of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 720 ft. from the center of line 4-1; 8 ft. wide, 6 ft. face, runs N. 70° W., 12 ft. to face.
Value, \$50.
- No. 1 The discovery cut of the Maud S No. 4 lode, the center of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line, 110 ft. from the center of line 3-4; 12 ft. wide, 14 ft. long; 5 ft. deep; long sides bear N. 71° W. and S. 71° E.
Value, \$60.
