LOCATION

This survey is located in the SW¹/₄ sec. 28 and the NE. and NW. quarters of sec. 33, T. 32 S., R. 4 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

The survey of this claim is wholly within the location as marked on the ground. Cors. Nos. 1 and 4 of the Cloudy Day lode are identical with the corners of the location; Cors. Nos. 2 and 3 differ to the extent previously shown.

EXPENDITURES

The improvements and the value of the labor and improvements made upon the lode location of said mining claim by the claimant or his grantors are as follows:

The discovery cut of the Cloudy Day lode, the face of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line 585.49 ft. from a point on line 2-3, 201.35 ft. from Cor. No. 3; 5 ft. wide, 8 ft. face, runs S. 20°00' W., 10 ft. to face and portal of tunnel 5 x 7 ft. in size, running S. 20°00' W., 50 ft.; thence S. 70°00' E., 40 ft. to winze, 5 x 7 ft., 45 ft. deep to face of tunnel 5 x 7 ft. in size, running S. 20°00' W., 196 ft.; thence N. 70°00' W., 80 ft. to breast. Partly caved.

Sur. No. 5 Green Mountain Quartz Mine lode, approved July 8, 1887; Cors. Nos. 3 and 5 are marked by fir stakes in mounds of stone. Line 3-5 was found to be S. 56°08' E., 582.37 ft., instead of S. 55° E., 600 ft., as approved.
