Sur. No. 8 First Extension South on the Green Mountain Quartz Mine lode approved July 13, 1887; Cor. No. 4 is a fir stake in a mound of stone. Line 3-4 was found to be N. 11°50' E., 1,495.0 ft., instead of N. 10°00' E., 1,500.00 ft. as approved.
