CHAINS

- No. 4 A cut, the NW. end of which bears N. 86°00' E., 382.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1 Emma and Amy No. 2 lode; 8 ft. wide, 6 ft. deep, running S. 70° E., 25 ft. to face.
Value of cut, \$250.00.
- No. 5 A cut, the west end of which bears S. 63°22' E., 303.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1 Emma and Amy No. 2 lode; 6 ft. wide, 6 ft. deep, running S. 80° E., 12.0 ft. to face.
Value of cut, \$100.00.
- No. 6 A cut, the west end of which bears S. 56°01' E., 548.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1 Emma and Amy No. 2 lode; 8 ft. wide, 8 ft. deep, running East, 12.0 ft. to face.
Value of cut, \$125.00.

MEMORANDUM

The posts with which the corners of this survey were monumented are made of three foot lengths of galvanized iron pipe, 1 in. diam., with about 5 inches of one end split and bent back to form flanges. A plain brass cap, 2 inches in diameter upon which the requisite figures and letters are stamped with steel dies, is securely fitted to the top.
