CHAINS

Tract A.

July 31, 1914.

Beginning at Cor. No. 1, which I establish identical with Cor. No. 8 of H. E. S. No. 130, Tract A, surveyed, which is a sandstone, 26 x 12 x 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 8 H E S 130 on SW. face, with a cross (X) on top. I mark the stone 1 H E S 129 on N. face, for Cor. No. 1 of this survey; from which

A maple, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 86°45' E., 23 lks. dist.,

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 58°15' W., 38 lks. dist.,

A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 83°00' W., 26 lks. dist., all trees blazed and scribed 8 H E S 130 BT, and 1 H E S 129 BT.

Cor. W. H. 16, of listing survey, a post mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor, bears N. 45°00' W., 130 lks. dist. I destroy the same.

Pits and mounds impracticable at this and all other cors.

Cor. No. 1 of H.E.S. No. 130, identical with the $\frac{1}{2}$ cor. of secs. 6 and 31, Tps. 21 and 22 S., R. 10 W., a tree cor., mkd. and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, bears S. 11°04' E., 75.02 chs. dist.

The mag. bearing of the true meridian at 8 a.m., l.m.t. is 21°30' W.; the angle thus determined gives the mag. decl. 21°30' E. The mean mag. decl. is 21°24.3' E.

Thence I run

N. 85°30' E., on true line to Cor. No. 2.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth. Ascend.

14.00 Spur ridge, bears N. and S., 140 ft. above Cor. 1. Descend.

17.00 A dry ravine, course N., 65 ft. below spur ridge. Ascend.

18.90 Spur ridge, bears N. and S., 50 ft. above ravine. Descend.

21.55 A dry ravine, course N., 120 ft. below spur ridge.

22.54 To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. W. H. 15 of listing survey, a sandstone boulder, 3 ft. E. and W., 3 ft. N. and S., 1 ft. high, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor. I mark this stone with a cross (X) for exact chaining point, 2 H E S 129 N. of cross; from which

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 60°00' W., 84 lks. dist.,

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 11°40' W., 79 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 2 H E S 129 BT.

Land, mountainous.
 Timber, fir and alder.
 Soil, 2nd rate.

Thence

S. 79°32' E., on true line to Cor. 3.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth. Continue along foot of mountain.
