

HOMESTEAD ENTRY SURVEY NO. 129  
 METES AND BOUNDS SURVEY OF MARSHEL WAGGONER, HOMESTEAD ENTRY  
 SIUSLAW NATIONAL FOREST, OREGON.

CHAINS 6.70	Harvey Creek, 40 lks. wide, course NW.
19.00	Dry wash, course SW. Leave level and enter rolling land, bears NW. and SE.
21.15	To Cor. No. 12, on N. side of road exemption.  In place of temp. stake, I set a sandstone, 24 x 10 x 8 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 12, mkd. 12 H E S 129 on NW. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which  An alder, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 41°30' E., 4½ lks. dist.,  A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 82°15' E., 54 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 12 H E S 129 BT.  Land, level and rolling. Timber, fir, cedar, maple and alder. Soil, 1st rate.  Cor. No. 5, H. E. S. No. 129, Tract A., heretofore described, bears S. 0°40' W., 30.5 lks. dist.
	Thence  N. 0°40' E., on true line to Cor. 13.  Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
.91	To Cor. No. 13, identical with Cor. W.H. 12 of listing survey, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor; in place of which I set a sandstone, 26 x 12 x 9 ins., 16 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 13, mkd. 13 H E S 129, on SW. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which  A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 85°30' E., 62 lks. dist.,  An alder, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 62°45' W., 36 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 13 H E S 129 BT.  Land, rolling. Timber, fir, maple and alder. Soil, 2nd rate.
	Thence  N. 70°22' W., on true line to Cor. 14.  Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
.53	Dry wash, course SW. Leave heavy and enter scattering timber, bears NE. and SW.
7.94	To Cor. No. 14, identical with Cor. W.H. 11 of listing survey, a stake, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor, in place of which I set a sandstone, 24 x 12 x 6 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 14, mkd. 14 H E S 129 on S. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which  A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 33°25' E., 77½ lks. dist.,  A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 15°25' W., 108 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 14 H E S 129 BT.  August 1, 1914, at Cor. No. 10, I set off 18°06' N. on the decl. arc, and at apparent noon, I observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting lat. is 43°42' N.
