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HOMESTEAD ENTRY SURVEY NO. 129 METES AND BOUNDS SURVEY OF MARSHEL WAGGONER, HOMESTEAD ENTRY SIUSLAW NATIONAL FOREST, OREGON

CHAINS

August 3, 1914.
Thence

S. 73°04' W., on true line to Cor. 15.

Over rolling land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

5.10 Spur ridge, bears N. and S. Leave rolling land and enter mountainous land, bears N. and S. Descend.

7.30 Dry ravine, course S. 50 ft. below spur ridge. Continue to descend. Enter heavy timber, bears N. and S.

10.50 Leave mountainous and enter bottom land, bears E. and W., 30 ft. below last named ravine.

15.84 To Cor. No. 15, identical with Cor. W.H. 10, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor, in place of which I set a sandstone, 26 x 14 x 6 ins., 16 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 15, mkd. 15 H E S 129 on S. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 86°35' E., 24 lks. dist., blazed and scribed 15 H E S 129 BT.

A bearing rock, 6 ft. NE. and SW., 4 ft. NW. and SE., 2 ft. high, mkd. BR with a cross (X) on SE. face, bears N. 45°15' W., 6 lks. dist.

Land, rolling, level and mountainous.
Timber, fir, maple and alder.
Soil, 1st and 2nd rate.

Thence

N. 71°50' W., on true line to Cor. 16.

Over bottom land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

8.00 Dry ravine, course SW. Leave bottom and enter mountainous land, bears NW. and SE. Ascend along foot of mountain.

14.15 Dry ravine, course SW.

20.61 To Cor. No. 16, identical with Cor. W.H. 9 of listing survey.

An open bed rock, 40 ft. N. and S., 20 ft. E. and W., mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor. I mark a large cross (X) with 16 H E S 129 SW. of cross, about 125 lks. from and about 40 ft. above foot of mountain; from which

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 57°10' E., 69 lks. dist.,

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 85°45' W., 110 lks. dist., both trees blazed and scribed 16 H E S 129 BT.

Land, level and mountainous.
Timber, fir and alder.
Soil, 1st and 2nd rate.

Thence

N. 27°24' W., on true line to Cor. 17.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth. Ascend.

4.50 Spur ridge, bears NE. and SW., 60 ft. above Cor. 16. Leave heavy and enter scattering timber, bears NE. and SW. Descend.
