To Cor. No. 17, 50 ft. below spur ridge, identical with Cor. W.H. 8 of listing survey, a sandstone boulder, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor, in place of which, (after removing), I set a sandstone, 30 x 18 x 14 ins., 20 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 17, mkd. 17 H E S 129 on W. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

An alder, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 60°45' W., 14 lks. dist.,

An alder, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 84°45' W., 39 lks. dist.,
 both trees blazed and scribed 17 H E S 129 BT.

Land, mountainous.
 Timber, fir and alder.
 Soil, 3rd rate.

Thence

N. 2°30' E., on true line to Cor. 18.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

6.46 To Cor. 18, identical with Cor. W.H. 7 of listing survey, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor, in place of which I set a sandstone, 24 x 12 x 8 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 18, mkd. 18 H E S 129 on SW. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

A maple, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 56°00' E., 35 lks. dist.,

An alder, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 40°30' W., 15 lks. dist.,
 both trees blazed and scribed 18 H E S 129 BT.

Land, mountainous.
 Timber, fir, maple and alder.
 Soil, 3rd rate.

Thence

West, on true line to Cor. 19.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth. Descend.

.60 Leave mountainous and enter bottom land, bears N. and S., 25 ft. below Cor. 18.

1.20 North Fork of Harvey Creek, 30 lks. wide, course S.

2.00 Leave bottom and enter rolling land, bears N. and S.

3.40 To Cor. No. 19, identical with Cor. W.H. 6 of listing survey, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by Peter S. Rice, Assistant Ranger and Surveyor, in place of which I set a sandstone, 28 x 24 x 16 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, for cor. 19, mkd. 19 H E S 129 on SE. face, with a cross (X) on top; from which

An alder, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 73° E., 31 lks. dist.,

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 2°40' W., 94 lks. dist.,
 both trees blazed and scribed 19 H E S 129 BT.

Land, mountainous, level and rolling.
 Timber, fir, maple and alder.
 Soil, 1st and 3rd rate.
