I set temporary stakes for cors. on either side of road, 15.15 lks. right angle dist. from the center line at the intersection of the past and proceeding courses on the side lines.

Thence I run

N. 35°00' W., along center line of road.

I set temporary stakes for cors. on either side of road, 15.15 lks. right angle dist. from the center line at the intersection of the past and proceeding courses on the side lines.

July 22, 1914: At this point in center of road, I set off 20°21' N. on the decl. arc, and at 12^h 06^m, l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat. is 43°41' N.

Thence I run

N. 16°00' E., along center line of road.

After adjusting the end line of the claim to comply with sec. 25, circular 235,

I set temp. stakes for cors. on either side of road, 15.15 lks. right angle dist. from the center line at the intersection of the side lines of the road with the end lines of the claim.

July 23, 1914: Beginning at Cor. No. 1 of this survey, which I make identical with the ¼ sec. cor. on N. bdy. of sec. 6, T. 22 S., R. 10 W., which is a fir tree, 26 ins. diam., marked ¼ S 6 on S. face; from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 10°00' E., 93 lks. dist., marked as described by the Surveyor General.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 26°10' E., 55 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 6 BT.

From this cor., Cor. No. 21 of listing survey bears N. 74°55' W., 1.73 chs. dist., which I destroy.

(Note: I make this cor. identical with the ¼ sec. cor. in order to better maintain the permanency of both cors., and in order to obviate the necessity for establishing a H.E.S. cor. so near a regular public land cor. I omitted the claim markings on this cor. to save confusion.)

Thence I run

N. 22°30' E., on a calculated random line, and at 14.07 chs. fall 3.5 lks. N. 67°30' W. of Cor. No. 20 of listing survey.

(The true course of this line is N. 22°39' E., 14.07 chs.)

Returning to Cor. No. 1 of this survey, above described, I run

N. 22°39' E., on a true line. (unlisted land)

Over mountainous land, through heavy fir, alder and maple timber and dense undergrowth.

To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. No. 20 of listing survey, a sandstone boulder, 3 x 3 x 2½ ft. high, I destroy list survey markings and mark it with a cross on top and 2 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which
