CHAINS

A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears East, 54 lks. dist.,
 marked X 2 HES 130 BT.

A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 16°30' E., 28 lks. dist.,
 marked X 2 HES 130 BT.

Thence I sight to Cor. No. 19 of listing survey, and run

N. 80°30' E., on a true line. (Listing surveyor evidently incor-
 rectly reported the bearing of this line.) Passing to List No.
 6-532.

Over mountainous land; through heavy fir, maple, cedar and alder
 timber and undergrowth.

4.38 To Cor. No. 3, identical with Cor. No. 19 of listing survey, which
 I destroy, and in its place

Set a sandstone, 28 x 16 x 9 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, over a
 stone marked with a cross for cor. No. 3 of this survey, marked
 3 HES on side facing the claim; from which

An alder, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 83°00' E., 56 lks. dist.,
 marked X 3 HES 130 BT.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 74°15' W., 40 lks. dist.,
 marked X 3 HES 130 BT.

Thence I sight to Cor. No. 18 of listing survey, and run

N. 20°10' E., on a true line.

Descend over mountainous land, through heavy fir, cedar, alder and
 maple timber.

1.32 Dry ravine, course W., 30 ft. below Cor. No. 3; ascend.

2.41 To Cor. No. 4 (35 ft. above ravine), identical with Cor. No. 18 of
 listing survey, which I destroy and in its place

Set a sandstone, 30 x 16 x 10 ins., 20 ins. in the ground, over a
 stone marked with a cross for Cor. No. 4 of this survey, marked
 4 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 81°00' E., 56 lks. dist.,
 marked X 4 HES 130 BT.

A maple, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 53°00' E., 9 lks. dist.,
 marked X 4 HES 130 BT.

July 23, 1914: At this cor. I set off 20°09' N. of the decl. arc,
 and at 12^h 06^m, l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the
 resulting lat. is 43°41' N.

Thence I sight to Cor. No. 17 of listing survey, and run

N. 78°18' W., on a true line.

Over mountainous land, through heavy fir, cedar, alder and maple
 timber and dense undergrowth.

4.00 Leave heavy and enter scattering timber, bears N. and S.

4.50 To Cor. No. 5, identical with Cor. No. 17 of listing survey, which
 I destroy, and in its place

Set a sandstone, 24 x 10 x 10 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, over a
 stone marked with a cross for Cor. No. 5 of this survey, marked
