CHAINS

5 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 85°00' E., 43 lks. dist.,  
marked X 5 HES 130 BT.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 26°30' E., 42 lks. dist.,  
marked X 5 HES 130 BT.

Thence I run

N. 40°00' W., on a random line, and at 36.95 chs., fall 43 lks.  
S. 50°00' W. of Cor. No. 16 of listing survey.

(The true course of this line is N. 39°20' W., 36.95 chs.)

Returning to Cor. No. 5 of this survey, above described, I run

N. 39°20' W., on a true line.

Ascend over mountainous land, through scattering fir, cedar, alder  
and maple timber.

6.75 Spur, slopes W., 50 ft. above Cor. No. 5; descend.

9.40 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW., 75 ft. below spur; ascend.

11.00 Spur, slopes SW., 50 ft. above spring branch; descend.

12.15 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW.; thence along SW. slope.

20.50 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW.; ascend.

22.00 Spur, slopes SW., 60 ft. above spring branch; gradual descent along  
SW. slope.

36.95 To Cor. No. 6, identical with Cor. No. 16 of listing survey, which  
I destroy, and in its place

Set a sandstone, 24 x 14 x 6 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, over a  
stone marked with a cross for Cor. No. 6 of this survey, marked  
6 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 29°00' E., 33 lks. dist.,  
marked X 6 HES 130 BT.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 2°00' W., 36 lks. dist.,  
marked X 6 HES 130 BT.

July 23, 1914.

July 24, 1914: From Cor. No. 6 of this survey, above described, I  
run

North, on a random line, and at 25.17 chs., fall 28½ lks. W. of  
Cor. No. 15 of listing survey.

(The true course of this line is N. 0°39' E., 25.17 chs.)

Returning to Cor. No. 6 of this survey, above described, I run

N. 0°39' E., on true line.

Ascend over mountainous land, through scattering fir, cedar, alder  
and maple timber and dense undergrowth.

2.00 Spur, slopes W., 50 ft. above Cor. No. 6; descend along W. slope.

2.50 Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.

22.90 Mouth of ravine, 40 ft. below spur; continue along foot of mountain.
