CHAINS

Over level cultivated land.

2.00 Harvey Creek, 50 lks. wide, course SW.

3.40 Fence, bears NE. and SW.

6.50 Leave cultivated land, bears NW. and SE.

7.30 Fence, bears NE. and SW.

12.60 Harvey Creek, 50 lks. wide, course SE.

13.10 Enter heavy fir, cedar, maple and alder timber, and dense undergrowth.

14.75 Harvey Creek, 50 lks. wide, course SW.

26.90 Cedar Creek (dry), 5 lks. wide, course S.

27.18 To Cor. No. 16. In place of temporary stake,

Set a sandstone, 30 x 16 x 5 ins., 20 ins. in the ground, over a stone marked with a cross for Cor. No. 16 of this survey, marked 16 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which

A maple, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 37°40' W., 48 lks. dist., marked X 16 HES 130 BT.

A maple, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 55°00' W., 77 lks. dist., marked X 16 HES 130 BT.

From this cor., Cor. No. 9 of Tract. "A" bears S. 49°15' E., 33.4 lks. dist.

July 27, 1914: At this cor. I set off 19°17' N. on the decl. arc, and at 12<sup>h</sup> 06<sup>m</sup>, l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat. is 43°42' N.

Thence I run

N. 49°15' W., on a true line, along N. bdy. of this claim, and the S. bdy. of List No. 6-683.

(Note:- The bearing of this line has been changed somewhat so as to shorten the length of the claim in keeping with requirements of sec. 25, circular 235.)

Over level land, through heavy fir, cedar, alder and maple timber and dense undergrowth.

2.50 Leave level and ascend over mountainous land, bears N. and S.

4.50 To Cor. No. 17, 35 ft. above Cor. No. 16.

Set a sandstone, 28 x 12 x 6 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, over a stone marked with a cross for Cor. No. 17 of this survey, marked 17 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 80°30' E., 47 lks. dist., marked X 17 HES 130 BT.

An alder, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 51°00' W., 10 lks. dist., marked X 17 HES 130 BT.

Cor. No. 13 of listing survey bears N. 15°12' E., 93 lks. dist., which I destroy.

July 27, 1914

July 28, 1914: Thence I run
