An alder, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 69°00' E., 49 lks. dist., marked X 20 HES 130 BT.

A maple, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 10°30' W., 62 lks. dist., marked X 20 HES 130 BT.

Thence I sight Cor. No. 9 of listing survey, and run S. 82°07' E., on a true line.

Over mountainous land, through fir, cedar, alder and maple timber and dense undergrowth.

3.98 To Cor. No. 21, identical with Cor. No. 9 of listing survey, which I destroy, and in its place,

Set a sandstone, 24 x 12 x 8 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, over a stone marked with a cross for Cor. No. 21 of this survey, marked 21 HES 130 on side facing the claim; from which

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 5°30' E., 100 lks. dist., marked X 21 HES 130 BT.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 82°10' W., 100 lks. dist., marked X 21 HES 130 BT.

July 29, 1914:

(Note:- From Cor. No. 21 of this survey to Cor. No. 4 of listing survey, the boundaries are unduly crooked. I therefore simplify this line by eliminating Cors. 9, 8, 7, 6 and 5 of listing survey, which I destroy.)

From Cor. No. 21 of this survey, above described, I run

S. 37°00' E., on a calculated random line, and at 40.68 chs. fall 7 lks. N. 53°00' E. of Cor. No. 4 of listing survey.

(The true course of this line is S. 36°54' E., 40.68 chs.)

Returning to Cor. No. 21 of this survey, above described, I run

S. 36°54' E., on a true line, passing to unlisted land.

Over mountainous land, through heavy fir, cedar, alder and maple timber and dense undergrowth.

.70 Dry ravine, course NE.; ascend.

7.75 Spur, slopes NE., 50 ft. above ravine; descend 30 ft. to

9.70 Dry ravine, course NE.; ascend.

14.25 Spur, slopes NE., 150 ft. above ravine; descend 100 ft. to

16.75 Dry ravine, course NE.; ascend.

22.00 Spur, slopes NE., 50 ft. above ravine; descend through scattering timber.

36.00 Foot of descent, 100 ft. below spur; thence along creek bottom and foot of mountain.

37.10 Ascend NE. slope.
