	Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
2.00	Enter mountainous land, bears NE. and SW.
	Thence along SE. slope.
6.59	Cor. H/18 of listing survey No. 6-97, a fir tree, 48 ins. diam., mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, bears N.71°00'W., 49 lks. dist. I destroy all evidence of this cor.

	Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, along SE. slope.
