CHAINS

June 24, 1914: At Cor. No. 25 of this survey, I set off  $23^{\circ}26'N$ . on the decl. arc, and at apparent noon, I obs. the sun on the mer.; the resulting lat. is  $43^{\circ}04\frac{1}{2}'N$ .

June 24, 1914

June 25, 1914:

Thence -  $S.29^{\circ}33'W.$ , on true line to Cor. 28.

Over level land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

5.50 Enter swampy land, bears NW. and SE.

7.25 Leave swampy land, bears NE. and SW.

16.83 To Cor. No. 28, identical with Cor. H/23 of listing survey No. 6-97, a post, mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, in place of which I set a porphyry stone,  $24 \times 12 \times 8$  ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. 28, mkd. 28 H E S 143 on NW. face, with a cross (+) on top; from which

A hemlock, 16 ins. dia., bears  $N.49^{\circ}50'E.$ , 19 lks. dist.,

A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears  $S.4^{\circ}15'W.$ , 21 lks. dist.,

both trees blazed and scribed 28 H E S 143 B T.

Soil a dark loam, 1st rate.

Thence

$S.59^{\circ}30'W.$ , on true line to Cor. 29.

Over level land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.85 To Cor. No. 29, identical with Cor. H/24 of listing survey No. 6-97 and Cor. H/24 of listing survey No. 6-350, and will be identical with Cor. of H.E.S. No. 144, a fir tree, 36 ins. diam., mkd. and witnessed as described by the listing surveyor, I mark tree 29 H E S 143 on N. face, with a blaze on the NE. and W. faces for Cor. 29; from which

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears  $S.85^{\circ}00'E.$ , 32 lks. dist.,

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears  $S.29^{\circ}35'E.$ , 41 lks. dist.,

both trees blazed and scribed 29 H E S 143 B T.

Soil a dark loam, 1st rate.

Thence

$S.86^{\circ}08'W.$ , on true line to Cor. 30.

Along line 6 - 5, H.E.S. No. 144.

Over level land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

.32 Rock Creek, 15 lks. wide, course S.

Leave heavy and enter scattering timber, bears N. and S.

1.23 Part of Rock Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S.

6.40 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course SE.

8.00 Enter clearing, bears NE. and SW.
