The mag. bearing of the true mer. at 8h a.m., l.m.t., June 26, 1914, is N.20° 58' W.; the angle thus determined gives the mag. decl. 20° 58' E. The mean mag. decl. is 20° 52.3' E.

Lat. 43° 4' N. and long. 122° 43' W.

Thence I run

N. 49° 24' E. on true line to Cor. No. 2.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.52 Trail (Forest Service), brs. N. & S.

2.71 Telephone line (Forest Service), brs. N. & S.

2.60 Leave timber and undergrowth, and enter swampy land, brs. NW. & SE.

5.50 Leave swampy land, brs. NW. & SE.

6.07 To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. H/3 of listing survey List 6-350, an alder tree, 4 ins. diam., mkd. and witnessed as described by Vernon V. Harpham, Assistant Forest Ranger. In place of tree, which I remove, I set a porphyry stone, 28 x 16 x 10 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, for Cor. No. 2, mkd. 2 H E S 144 on S. face, with a cross (+) on top; from which

A fir, 16 ins. diam., brs. N. 78° 30' E., 49 lks. dist.,

A fir, 28 ins. diam., brs. N. 16° 50' W., 25 lks. dist.,

both blazed and scribed 2 H E S 144 B T.

Land, rolling.

Timber, pine, fir, spruce, hemlock and maple on this and all other lines.

Soil a dark loam, 1st rate.

No. 3, mkd. 3 H E S 144 on S. face, with a cross (+) on top; from which
