CHAINS

June 27, 1914, at Cor. No. 10 of this survey, I set off  $23^{\circ} 21' N.$  on the decl. arc, and at apparent noon, I obs. the sun on the mer.; the resulting lat. is  $43^{\circ} 3\frac{1}{2}' N.$

Thence

S.  $22^{\circ} 9' W.$ , on true line to Cor. No. 11.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

To Cor. No. 11, identical with Cor. H/29 of listing survey, a tree, mkd. and witnessed as described by Vernon V. Harpham, Assistant Forest Ranger; in place of the tree, which I remove, I set a porphyry stone,  $24 \times 12 \times 10$  ins., 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. No. 11, mkd. 11 H E S 144 on NW. face, with a cross (+) on top; from which

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears  $N.47^{\circ} 0' E.$ , 54 lks. dist.,

A fir, 12 ins. diam., brs. S.  $14^{\circ} 0' W.$ , 52 lks. dist.,

both trees blazed and scribed 11 H E S 144 B T.

Land rolling.

Soil a dark loam, 1st rate.

Thence

S.  $61^{\circ} 12' W.$ , on true line to Cor. No. 12.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

To Cor. No. 12, identical with Cor. H/30 of listing survey, a small tree mkd. and witnessed as described by Vernon V. Harpham, Assistant Forest Ranger; in place of the tree, which I remove, I set a porphyry stone,  $30 \times 22 \times 12$  ins., 20 ins. in the ground, for Cor. No. 12, mkd. 12 H E S 144 on N. face, with a cross (+) on top; from which

A fir, 10 ins. diam., brs. N.  $79^{\circ} 35' E.$ , 39 lks. dist.,

A fir, 28 ins. diam., brs. S.  $50^{\circ} 35' E.$ , 18 lks. dist.,

both blazed and mkd. 12 H E S 144 B T.

Land, rolling.

Soil a dark loam, 1st rate.

From this cor. the Forest Service Monument for listing surveys Nos. 6-350 and 6-605, a large boulder, mkd. and witnessed as described by Vernon V. Harpham, Assistant Forest Ranger, brs. S.  $38^{\circ} 45' W.$ , 3.10 chs. dist. This monument was also used for listing survey No. 6-97, with supplemental listings thereto. I destroy said marks on monument.

Note: I consider the lines from Cor. H/30 to Cor. H/1 of listing survey No. 6-350, which I find brs. N.  $4^{\circ} 30' W.$ , 4.50 chs. dist. instead of N.  $28^{\circ} 0' W.$ , 4.50 chs. dist., as given in my instructions, and from the last named cor. to Cor. H/2 of listing survey No. 6-605 are unduly crooked, made by unnecessary exclusions. I also consider that the original intentions, possibly, was to list this small area. I simplify bdy. as follows:

From Cor. No. 12, I run

N.  $28^{\circ} 39' W.$ , on true line to Cor. No. 13.

Over rolling land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
