CHAINS

U.S.L.M. No. 179

September 3, 1916: It is found necessary to establish a U. S. Location Monument, there being no corners of the public survey within two miles. The most suitable location for the monument is at the point now occupied by the Forest Service Monument, a rock set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of the listing survey, which is on line between corners 1 and 2 of listing survey, as ascertained from a retracement thereof. This location is exceptionally good for the reason that it is in plain view from the trail and because it marks the west boundary of road exemption, it being also corner No. 1 of this survey.

I destroy old Forest Service monument and in its place

Set a granite stone 30x9x7 ins., 20 ins. in the ground, for U.S. L.M. No. 179, marked with a cross (X) on top and U S L M 179 on south face; from which

An ash, 26 ins. dia., bears N.52°55'E., 119 lks. dist., marked X U S L M 179 B T.

An alder, 14 ins. dia., bears N.18°30'W., 18 lks. dist., marked X U S L M 179 B T.

Raise a mound of stone, 6 ft. base, 4 ft. high, alongside.

The junction of a small creek, locally known as Nicholas Creek, with the South Umpqua River, bears S.45°E., 1.56 chs. dist.

West end of a log bridge over Nicholas Creek bears N.82°E., 0.18 chs. dist.

A rocky peak (no name), first peak up river from Ackers Butte, approximately 900 ft. high, bears S.48°30'E., about 1/3 mile distant.

Lat. 43°04'N.; long. 122°40'W.

H.E.S. No. 179

All listing corners referred to herein are properly identified, being marked and witnessed as described by the Forest Service in the listing survey.

TRACT A

September 3, 1916: I begin at cor. No. 1 of this survey, identical with U.S.L.M. No. 179, which is a granite stone, 9x7x10 ins. above ground, heretofore described, on west side of road exemption.

I mark the stone 1 HES 179 on side facing the claim.

From the corner

An ash, 30 ins. dia., bears N.84°45'E., 40 lks. dist., marked X 1 HES 179 B T.

An alder, 14 ins. dia., bears N.18°30'W., 18 lks. dist., marked X 1 HES 179 B T (also scribed for U.S.L.M.)

Thence I run

N.49°01'W., on a true line (this line has been previously retraced in order to establish U.S.L.M. No. 179 and cor. No. 1 thereon).
