CHAINS

(The true bearing and length of the line from the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. bet. secs. 1 and 12 to the closing cor. bet. secs. 1 and 2 is S.89°43'W., 41.46 chs.)

August 28, 1917

August 29, 1917: From the closing corner bet. secs. 1 and 2, above described, I run

N.0°01'W. (recorded bearing) retracing the line bet. secs. 1 and 2.

32.04

Intersect the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. bet. fractional secs. 1 and 2, which is a stone, 12x8x6 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

(The true bearing and length of this line is N.0°01'W., 32.04 chs.)

There being no quarter corner set on the east boundary of fractional sec. 1, I run (in accordance with secs. 78 and 79 of the circular on "Restoration of Lost or Obliterated Corners").

East (parallel to mean of bearings of south boundary of sec. 1) on latitudinal $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. line, through fractional sec. 1.

41.46

(Calculated dist.) Set stake for temporary center of sec. 1.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. bet. secs. 1 and 12, I run

North (proportional bearing bet. east and west bdrs. of fractional sec. 1) on longitudinal $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. line.

31.82

Intersect the stake set for temporary center of fractional sec. 1.

No solar observation possible during day because of heavy timber.

August 29, 1917

August 30, 1917: From the stake set for temporary center of fractional sec. 1, I run

South, along longitudinal $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. line.

11.78

(Proportional measurement) Point for southwest cor. of Lot 6. Set a temporary stake.

Thence I run

East, on a true line, along south bdy. of Lot 6.

34.29

Intersect left bank of Umpqua River at mean high tide line and set a temporary stake for meander cor. and cor. No. 6 of this survey.

August 30, 1917: At cor. No. 1 of this survey, hereinafter described, I set off 9°01'N. on the decl. arc, and at 12h01m l.m.t., obs. the sun on the mer.; the resulting lat. is 43°41'N.
