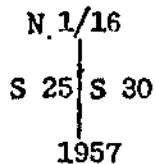


Dependent Resurvey of Portion of East Boundary, T. 29 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

- 13.64 Ravine, course NW, curving to N.; desc. 12 ft. over N. slope.
- 15.64 Leave slide area, enter logged area; desc. 88 ft. over NW. slope.
- 19.18 Abandoned cut road, bears E. and W.
- 19.53 Point for N. 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30.  
Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

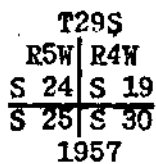
A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.  $9\frac{3}{4}^\circ$  E.,  $15\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., marked N1/16 S30 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.  $43\frac{1}{4}^\circ$  W., 87 lks. dist., marked N1/16 S25 BT.

Desc, 50 ft. over NW. slope.

- 21.80 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 180 ft. over N. slope, changing to NE. slope.
- 26.44 Ravine, course NW.; asc. 3 ft. over SW. slope.
- 27.03 Small spur, slopes NW.; desc. 56 ft. over steep N. slope.
- 28.28 Foot of descent and edge of cultivated field, bears W. and N.  $80^\circ$  E. descend 10 ft. over gradual N. slope, in field.
- 38.68 Left bank of South Myrtle Creek, course West.
- 39.06 Point for the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. point for cor. falls on the right bank of South Myrtle Creek.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, in bed rock of the stream bottom, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, with brass cap marked

A maple, 8 ins. diam., bears N.  $14^\circ$  E., 231 lks. dist., marked T29S R4W S19 BT.

A cottonwood, 16 ins. diam., bears S.  $28\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  E., 160 lks. dist., marked T29S R4W S30 BT.

A cottonwood, 20 ins. diam., bears S.  $43\frac{3}{4}^\circ$  W., 223 lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S25 BT.

A cedar, 11 ins. diam., bears N.  $21^\circ$  W., 143 lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S24 BT.

Land, steep ridges in S. portion, and bottom land of S. Myrtle Creek in N. portion. Soil, granular clay and loam in bottom land. Timber, fir, madrone, oak, maple, cedar and cottonwood; undergrowth, salal, black berry and reproduction of fir.
