

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 29 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

A maple, 15 ins. diam., bears S. $41\frac{1}{4}^\circ$ W., 299 lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S26 BT.

A maple, 9 ins. diam., bears N. $14\frac{3}{4}^\circ$ W., 90 lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S23 BT.

From this point the cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27, bears N. $88^\circ 05'$ W., 79.64 chs. dist., determined at record bearing and distance from the only remaining original bearing tree, as follows:

A white oak, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 6° W., 350 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 ft. high, with brass cap marked

A white oak, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 58° E., $105\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S23 BT.

A white oak, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 13° E., $151\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S26 BT.

A white oak, $12\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., bears S. 37° W., 77 lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S27 BT.

A white oak, 15 ins. diam., bears N. $15\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ W., 213 lks. dist., marked T29S R5W S22 BT.

From this cor. a locally established cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27, bears N. 6° W., 4 lks. dist., monumented with a $\frac{3}{4}$ in. galvanized pipe, flush with the ground.

from which locally established BTs.

A white oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 38° E., 46 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A white oak, 13 ins. diam., bears S. $53\frac{3}{4}^\circ$ E., 119 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

E. fork of a double white oak, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 18 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A white oak, 18 ins. diam., bears N. $75\frac{1}{4}^\circ$ W., 38 lks. dist., with S22 CS visible on open blaze.

A white oak, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 45° E., 54 lks. dist., with NE DLC 45 S visible on open blaze.

Land, mountainous. Soil, granular clay. Timber, fir, cedar, oak, maple, and madrone; undergrowth, scattering reproduction, madrone, willow, blackberry and poison oak.

From the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30 on the E. bdy. of the Tp. S. $89^\circ 35'$ W., between secs. 24 and 25.

Ascend 170 ft. over general SE. slope, through farm land sloping along S. Myrtle Creek.
