Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 32 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

N. 88° 46' W., bet. secs. 3 and 10.

Ascend 234 ft. over NE. slope.

8.90 Spur ridge, bears N. and S.; descend 409 ft. over broken NW. slope.

40.15 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10, determined at record bearing and distance from one of the original bearing trees:

A turned-out maple, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 58° E., 19 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S10 BT.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone to top, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 83° W., 135 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S10 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 17 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 103 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S3 BT.

N. 79° 04' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 835 ft. over NW. slope.

32.69 Stream, 5 lks. wide, course north; ascend 231 ft. over east slope.

39.67 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, maple and cedar; undergrowth, vine maple, arrowwood, huckleberry and hazel.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Sections 10 and 15, township 32 south, range 1 west are located in Douglas County on the north slope of the Umpqua and Rogue River divide in the foothills of the Cascade Range, approximately 9 miles northeast of Trail, Oregon. The land is mountainous, ranging from 2500 to 4500 ft in elevation and is timbered with second growth fir, maple, and madrona; the old growth fir has been removed for lumber. There is sufficient grass to provide summer pasture for a few cattle that roam the area, water is provided by Ragsdale Spring located in section 14 near the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of sections 14 and 15.

Logging roads provide the only entry to this portion of the township. There are no dwellings and no land under cultivation in sections 10 and 15; being valuable only for the production of timber. There are no known mineral deposits in the area.

The geographic position of the southeast corner of section 15 as given in the special instructions is as follows:

Latitude, 42° 46 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' N. Longitude, 122° 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' W.

The mean magnetic declination is 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' E.
