

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of the East Bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 7 W.

Point for the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears S. $21\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 121 lks. dist., marked T29S R6W S18 BT.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 77° W., 189 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S13 BT.

There are no bearing objects or bearing trees convenient in secs. 7 or 12.

From this point, the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12 on E. bdy. of Tp. bears N. $1^{\circ} 38'$ W., 76.72 chs. dist., perpetuated by the County Surveyor in 1921 with an iron pipe $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam., 4 ins. above ground, firmly set, from which an original bearing tree:

A sawed fir stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 65° E., 68 lks. dist., plainly blazed and healed. (Record dist., 70 lks.)

and trees marked by County Surveyor:

A sawed fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 48° E., 43 lks. dist., marked with healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 16 ins. diam., bears S. $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 62 lks. dist., with faint scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 15° W., 19 lks. dist., plainly blazed and healed.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. $10\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 55 lks. dist., marked T29S R6W S6 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 59° E., 77 lks. dist., marked T29S R6W S7 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 75° W., 144 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S12 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 38 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S1 BT.

Reset the iron pipe alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, cedar, madrona, maple and alder. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, Oregon grape and fern.
