Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A madrona, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 32° E., 36 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible.

A madrona, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 46° E., 23 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S34 BT on unhealed blaze.

A madrona, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 80° W., 50 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S33 BT. on unhealed blaze.

A rotted oak stump, size indeterminate, bears N. 47° W., 23 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.

and trees marked by Mensch in 1924.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 24° E., 14 lks. dist., plainly blazed and healed.

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 70° W., 41 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on unhealed blaze.

From the same point (the cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22), the cor. of secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21 bears N. 89° 05' W., 76.22 chs. dist., remonumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked

A sawed fir stump, 42 ins. diam., bears N. 20° E., 63 lks. dist., with faint scribe marks visible on opened blaze. (An original bearing tree)

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 39° E., 94 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S21 CS BT. (A 1957 bearing tree)

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 75° W., 22 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S17 CS BT. (A 1954 bearing tree.)

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 24½° W., 63 lks. dist., marked T29S R7W S17 CS BT. (A 1954 bearing tree.)

This cor. was remonumented in 1954 from the original NE. bearing tree, and four new bearing trees were marked. All but the one listed above were subsequently uprooted during logging operations, and the iron post was pulled up. The post was reset in 1957 by James W. Byron, who also marked the additional trees listed above.
