CHAINS

Metes and bounds survey of John V. Bradley Homestead Entry, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon.

Beginning at Cor. No. 1, identical with Cor. H/9 of listing survey, a stone, mkd. and witnessed as described by Asher Ireland, Assistant Forest Ranger, in place of which I set a basalt stone, 24x10 x8 ins., 14 ins. in the ground for Cor. No. 1, mkd. HES 93 on W. face, with a cross (+) on top; from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 38° 30' E., 94 lks. dist.

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 11° 45' E., 63 lks. dist.
 both trees blazed and scribed 1 HES 93 BT.

The U.S.L.M. No. 142, a conglomerate stone in place, 6 ft. N. and S., 3 ft. E. and W., 2 ft. high, mkd. US LM 142, with a cross (+) for exact point; bears S. 82° 09' E., 83.76 chs. dist., determined by traverse, from which

A pine, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 43° 05' E., 22 lks. dist.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 80° 00' E., 29½ lks. dist.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 51° 30' W., 52 lks. dist.

A pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 50° 15' W., 35½ lks. dist.
 each tree blazed and scribed USLM 142 BT.

The mean mag. decl. at Cor. No. 1, at 5 p.m. July 14, 1914, is 20° 31.4' E.

Thence S. 56° 15' W., on true line to Cor. 2.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth. Descend.

23.00 Leave mountainous land and enter rolling land, bears E. and W., 250 ft. below Cor. 1.

26.72 Forest Service Trail, bears NW. and SE.

31.28 Forest Service Telephone Line, bears Easterly and Westerly.

33.50 To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. H/1 of listing survey, a fir tree 36 ins. diam., mkd. and witnessed as described by Asher Ireland, Assistant Forest Ranger. I mark the tree 2 HES 93 on N. face, for Cor. 2, from which

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 88° 00' E., 105½ lks. dist.

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 21° 30' E., 100 lks. dist.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 14° 15' W., 68 lks. dist.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 74° 30' W., 73 lks. dist.,
 each tree mkd. 2 HES 93 BT.

Land, mountainous and rolling. Timber, pine and fir. Soil, 3rd rate.
 July 15, 1914.

Thence I run N. 56° 34' W., on true line to Cor. 3. July 13, 1914.
 Over rolling land, through scattering timber and undergrowth.

2.00 Forest Service Telephone Line, bears easterly and westerly.

6.98 To Cor. No. 3, identical with Cor. H/2 of listing survey, a basalt boulder, (in place), 5 ft. NE. and SW., 3 ft. NW. and SE., 1 ft. high, mkd. and witnessed as described by Asher Ireland, Assistant Forest Ranger. I mark the boulder 3 HES 93, with a cross (+) on top side, and S. end, for Cor. 3, from which
