Land, mountainous. Timber, pine and fir. Soil, very stony, 3rd rate.

Thence, S. 40° 43' E., on true line to Cor. 1.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth. Descend.

20.56 To Cor. No. 1, heretofore described, the place of beginning, 360 ft. below Cor. No. 9.

Total Area of H. E. S. No. 93, 147.80 acres.

The improvements on this claim, the property of claimant herein, consist of the following:

Log house, 16x18 ft., course of long sides N. and S., the SE. cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 3 N. 45°00'W., 7.50 chs. dist., very poor condition, value	Value \$75.00
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Log barn, 16x28 ft., course of long sides E. & W., the SE. cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 3, N. 60° 51' W., 2.27 chs. dist., very poor condition, value,--	<u>\$75.00</u>

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DESCRIPTION

The principal part of this claim lies on a mountainous south slope. The maximum elevation near Cor. 6 is about 1,000 ft. above Cor. 1; a small portion of the claim at the south end lies on rolling land. There is no part of the claim, that is clear of stone, that would exceed an area of one acre. The soil is very stony, 2nd and 3rd rate.

This entire claim lies within a burned over area, and a very small amount of green timber still remains within the claim, which is pine, fir and oak. The claim is covered with a dense growth of oak and elk brush. The general drainage is to the south, into the North Fork of the Umpqua River, which flows in a westerly direction along the south end of the claim. There is no elevation within the claim.

The land is non-mineral in character.

The nearest post office is at Hoaglin, Oregon, about 27½ miles in a westerly direction, and connected by the Forest Service Trail, which passes through the south part of the claim in an easterly and westerly direction.

The mean mag. decl. is 20° 31.4' E. at Cor. No. 1, at 5 p.m., July 14, 1914.
