Log barn, 24x44 ft., course of long sides NE. & SW., the NE. cor. of which bears from Cor. 2 S. 17° 45' W., 26.75 chs. dist., value,	\$250.00
Log woodshed, 12x14 ft., course of long sides NW. and SE., the NE. cor. of which bears from Cor. 2 S. 31° 50' W., 23.10 chs. dist., value,	\$ 40.00
Log smokehouse, 8x10 ft., course of long sides NE. and SW., the NE. cor. of which bears from Cor. 2 S. 31° W., 23.35 chs. dist., value,	\$ 40.00
About 314 rebs of pole and wire fencing, value,	\$125.00

DESCRIPTION

The principal part of this claim lies on a rolling south slope, while the northwest part of the claim is mountainous and quite broken; the greater part of the claim is covered with scattering pine and fir timber, with a scattering undergrowth of manzanita and elk brush. About 16 acres of the land within the claim are under cultivation. The soil is a dark reddish color, of volcanic origin, 1st rate.

The land is non-mineral in character.

The nearest post office is at Heaglin, Oregon, about 29 miles in a westerly direction, and connected by the Forest Service Trail.

No markings of adjacent or conflicting surveys found.
