Returning to cor. No. 4 of this survey above described, I run

S. 50° 38' W., on a true line.

Gradual descent through scattered pine and fir timber.

11.59 To Cor. No. 1, 15 ft. below cor. No. 4, the place of beginning.

Total area of H.E.S. No. 227, 29.59 acres.

There are no buildings on this tract.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This claim is a rolling tract with a gentle south slope, which was taken by the applicant as an addition to his present entry, accepted survey H.E.S. No. 142. It is in general covered with a scattered growth of fir and pine timber and some undergrowth. The soil is a rich clay loam, suited to the production of vegetables hay and grain.

There is no water on the tract except for a small spring.

There are no mineral indications.

The nearest post office is Hoaglin, Oregon, about twenty-nine miles in a westerly direction and connected by the Forest Service Trail.

The mean mag. decl. is 19° 30' E.

There are no conflicts. Accepted survey, H.E.S. No. 142, adjoins on the west and accepted surveys H.E.S. Nos. 93, 178 and 182 lie south and west of this claim and are all tied to U.S.L.M. No. 142.
