

Resurvey of the North Boundary of T. 32 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

pine. Undergrowth, tan oak, live oak, huckleberry, hazel, rhododendron and arrowwood.

N. 89° 09' W., resurveying N. bdy. of sec. 2.

Ascend NE. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

8.75 Top of spur, slopes NE.

14.75 Top of spur, slopes N.; descend steep rocky slope.

15.25 Bluff, 50 ft. high; enter heavy timber, bears N. and S.

21.72 Intersect the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 31 S., R. 9 W., which is a fir tree, 50 ins. diam., marked as described by the surveyor general. I mark bearing trees for this cor., as follows: from cor.

A live oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 74° E., 26 lks. dist., marked T31S R9W S36 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 15° W., 69 lks. dist., marked T31S R9W S35 BT.

Thence West, continuing my measurements.

23.65 Babes Creek, 30 lks. wide, course N.; ascend steep rocky slope.

39.47 Intersect the old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 2, which is a fir tree, 18 ins. diam., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I change this cor. to an angle point, destroying all marks on the cor. and remarking AP on N. side, from which

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 77° E., 15 lks. dist., marked AP BT. (Old B. T.)

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 87° W., 15 lks. dist., marked AP BT. (Old B. T.)

Thence N. 89° 34' W., continuing my measurements.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 2 only, with brass cap marked

from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 24° E., 63 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 55° W., 8 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT.

42.50 Top of steep ascent; ascend gradual slope. Leave heavy timber, bears N. and S.

44.00 Top of ridge, bears N. and S.; descend brushy slope.

49.50 Enter young timber, bears N. and S.

52.00 Ravine, course NW.; ascend.

56.50 Top of spur, slopes N.; descend.

60.65 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW.

61.78 Intersect the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 35 only, which is a basalt stone, 18x12x6 ins., loosely set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I perpetuate this cor., as follows: alongside the old cor.
